The nominee must be under 22 years old as of the date of nomination. (Nominee may be amateur or professional.)

Nominations should include the rationale for recommending the nominee. (The recommendation should be attached to the Nomination Form and should not exceed two pages.)

Information should include:

- > A brief history of the individual
- Nomination may be for a single act or for achievements over an extended period
- Nominee's area(s) of contribution (must be for one or more of the four categories)
- Special achievements and impact
- Awards and other recognition previously received

Additional letters of support, newspaper articles, etc. that support the nomination may also be attached.

## Dr. Alice Holloway Young

Alice Holloway Young was born on September 29, 1923, in Wise, Warrenton County, North Carolina. She received a Bachelor of Science degree from Bennett College and master's and Doctoral degrees in Education Supervision and Administration from the University of Rochester. She became employed with the Rochester City School District in 1952 and pioneered as an African American educator over the next four decades. A gifted teacher, an untiring advocate and administrator, she is recognized as an energetic champion for the school children of New York State and had a pronounced influence upon Rochester higher education.

In many of her achievements, Dr. Young was the first in the field. For example, she was one of the District's first African American Classroom teachers; the only African American reading specialist in the District; the first Vice Principal and Principal of elementary schools; first Title I Director (programs for educationally and economically deprived children; wrote and supervised the District's first integration programs including the Urban Suburban Program which is still in existence and other firsts as well.
